Innovation Online E-Learning

With the ever evolving threat of the Coronavirus to our community, we must practice "social distancing" and create as much physical space between people to slow or stop the transmission of the virus, at some point. To do this, we will continue all instruction online, so that staff and students can engage in learning at a distance (from home, relatives homes', etc.)

This is a guide that outlines all of the expected behaviors, supports, and outcomes for Innovation Online's "E-Learning" (online, distance learning). These guidelines will be in effect for as long as Innovation conducts instruction through E-Learning. Policies are subject to change as we adapt our practices.

E-LEARNING: CONTINUING CLASSES, JUST NOT ON CAMPUS

Learning will continue. Students' responsibilities to learn the schools' curriculum by engaging each other, their teachers, and their assignments has not changed at all. They will still be accountable to do just that. Now it is happening online. Similarly, teachers' responsibility of providing engaging and rigorous educational experiences remains the same. It, too, is online now.

WAYS TO LEARN ONLINE

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E-Learning happens in one of two ways:

- 1. Class happens live in real time. Students attend a virtual class together through video conference, livestream, or chat. This is called **Synchronous Learning**
- 2. Students complete or submit assignments by the due date either through e-mail, Google Classroom or another online website system set up by their teacher. **Asynchronous Learning**

E-Learning will require a shift in how you learn and connect with your classmates, teachers, counselors and other support staff. Your physical contact with them will be limited, so you have to use every way possible to stay connected, meet expectations and clearly communicate your needs.

When our E-Learning begins, teachers will share an overview of how their class is run, how assignments must be completed, and the schedule for their availability/class.

Student Expectations

- ★ Complete / Submit all assignments by their due dates.
- ★ Participate professionally and respectfully in any online classes or discussion groups
- ★ Remain in touch with your teachers through their live classroom sessions or via e-mail / text.
- ★ Check you E-mail all of the time (And PowerSchool, Innovation's Website, IG, FB for updates)!
- ★ Manage your time through the week, so you can complete / submit your assignments on time.
- ★ Communicate your feedback about E-Learning and any supports you need as often as possible with Innovation staff and your families.

WEEKLY SCHEDULE

We want to make your Innovation Online schedule as predictable and as close to your prior class schedule as possible. Remember all of your responsibilities as a student continue, just at a distance.

The schedule below and sample schedules show when teachers will be available for online classes or to give feedback and additional directions on assignments when asked. **IMPORTANT**: if the teacher is not streaming a live class, you **MUST** communicate with that teacher at least once during the blocked time.

3-hour Period: Some or all of the following can happen during Innovation Online's 3-hour period.

- ★ Teacher hosts a 30 min streaming class for students on ZOOM or Google Hangouts
- ★ Teacher hosts a discussion room on Google Classroom or Google Hangouts
- ★ Teacher is responds to students' questions or gives students feedback on assignments through e-mail, text message, Google Hangouts, etc.
- ★ Students complete/submit assignments given by teacher
- ★ Students participate in a discussion board or complete group projects
- ★ Students give presentations online to their peers and teachers

Instruction Each week, teachers will post an update with an overview of the goals and assignments w/ due dates for that week. Please allow teachers 24 hours to answer any questions you may have. .

Assignments Students expect to have 3-4 hours of work per week maximum. This means completing a minimum of three assignments per week for each course. Here are some examples of assignments:

- ★ Standardized assessment practice problems AP, SAT, Regents, SPOs, MPOs, quizzes, journal entries, etc.
- ★ Longer assessments Essays, Math Projects, Science Labs, PowerPoint Presentations, Research Papers, Arts Projects, etc.
- ★ These assignments can take the form of reading/watching/listening to videos or pre-recorded lessons, engaging with classmates on discussion boards, work with classmates on a document, attending class virtually via ZOOM or Google Hangouts, etc.

Teachers are creating assignments in a manner that provides additional supports to our students with particular learning needs.

Grading

We are still using PowerSchool for grades. Teachers will grade assignments as soon as possible and post them to PowerSchool.

Students, when submitting assignments by e-mail, use this **template format** to submit them.

Teachers will use four* categories for E-Learning:

- 1. Classwork (35%) Handouts, Worksheets, Online Assignments, SPOs, MPOs
- 2. **Participation (25%)** Students in virtual space, have e-mailed teachers, conversed over text message, discussion groups, etc.
- 3. **Projects (15%)** Projects, Labs, Essays, Longer Multi-Step Assignments, Summative Assessments
- 4. **Tests/Quizzes (15%)** Google Forms, Regents Practice Problems, etc. (students write 1 2 sentence explanations for multiple choice responses).

*HW (5%) & Exit Tickets (5%) These categories will not have additional assignments during E-Learning. They're weight is 5% each because there may be assignments in them from week one of Marking Period 5.

Academic Honesty

Proper conduct during distance learning, and complete honesty in all academic endeavors is required. Submission of false data, falsification of records, misconduct during streamed classes or discussion posts, foul language, cyberbullying and plagiarism are among the violations of academic integrity. Students who do not meet these standards will be subject to receiving a failing grade for the individual assignment, will need to complete additional make up assignments, and may be at risk of not passing the course overall.

Attendance. The only way for students to be successful in Innovation Online, is by engaging their teachers and support staff. For classes, attendance is taken in two ways:

Attendance is taken when:

- ★ Participating in classes that are streamed live **during** the 3-hour instructional block
- ★ e-mailing / texting check-ins with teachers during the 3-hour instructional block (If you do not engage with your teacher during the 3-hour instructional block, reach out to teachers. Otherwise you are absent and may not be able to make up assignments.)
- ★ submitting/completing assignments **outside** of 3-hour instructional block (you are marked present according to assignment due date.)
 - (If you do not submit/complete assignments by due date, <u>reach out to teachers</u>. Otherwise you are absent and may not be able to make up assignments.)

Office Hours. UPDATE: School Guidance Counselors, College Counselors, Case Managers, Deans, Main Office Staff and Speech Service Providers will be available during Office Hours and during the 1-7 period schedule to meet/work with students online. They will continue providing services to their caseloads and students, primarily in a one-on-one format, throughout the course of each work day. The Counseling staff will be available to help support students who are absent/cannot participate, and may choose to lead small groups online for study sessions, tutorials, or personal support. Counselors will work with the Administration, including the Dean's Office, to communicate with families about attendance/participation concerns and support students in getting back on track. Additionally, IEP services will continue as scheduled via phone conference. Parents can still make a request for initial evaluation or for any chance in IEP services during the school closure.
